

Camil Demetrescu is an associate professor at the Department of Computer, Control, and Management Engineering of Sapienza University of Rome. He conducts research at the intersection of different areas in computing, ranging from software security, programming languages and systems, algorithms and data structures, and software engineering. His research activity focuses on the design of tools and techniques for analyzing and optimizing software systems, with particular emphasis on vulnerability detection, performance analytics, and incremental computing. He is the coordinator of CyberChallenge.IT 2017, an introductory training program in cybersecurity for talented high school and undergraduate students. He has been principal investigator and site coordinator of several research projects. Camil Demetrescu has been visiting scientist at Microsoft Research -- Silicon Valley, at the AT&T Research Laboratories -- Florham Park, and at the IT University of Copenhagen. His Ph.D. thesis was awarded one of the two 2002 Prizes of the Italian Chapter of the EATCS for the best dissertations in Theoretical Computer Science. He has served as steering committee member and program committee chair of premier conferences such as the European Symposium on Algorithms. Camil Demetrescu regularly serves in the program and artifact evaluation committees of flagship international scientific conferences in computer science. He has organized several scientific events at Bertinoro and Dagstuhl and has been the general chair of the 30th European Conference on Object-Oriented Programming (ECOOP). He is member of the editorial board of the "Mathematical Programming Computation" (MPC) journal.
